1672- PERAMBULATION OF THE PARISH

Memorandum of 14th day of May, 1672 there was a perambulation or a viewing of the westerne and northerne bounds of this parish of Chardstocke by the Vicar and diverse other the Parishioners.

The bounds against Membury are in Mr **Leggs** Eastcombs ten foote from the ditch, where there is now a stone standing, in which place formerly stood a thorne, and afterwards the bounds are in a ground called Greyditch ten foote from the banke into the said ground and where the banke ends ten foote from the ditch, and onwards Northwest from Chalhanger gate the bounds passe into a ground belonging to Mr **Daubneyes** tenement ten foote within the ditch, and afterwards the bounds passe Northwestward upon Bealy downe along by the hedges of downe end tenement, which hedge is in Membury parish.

And afterwards against Wambrooke the bounds are at the utmost corner of Bealy farme next Deereham upon Bealy downe, where there is a crosse cutt in the ground by the hedge & a stone pitcht into it, and from hence the bounds go Eastward upon the downe by a ridge of stones, and so to a little stone burrow in the middle of the rode going to Crawley, where there is another crosse cutt in the earth, and from thence Northeastwards to a marke of some stones upon top of the hill, at the south side of the enclosure which one **Tristram**Warren once enclosed and from thence downe to a little stone burrow on the North side of a little path below the ground that **Thomas Guppy** enclosed, and from hence Eastwards to another stone burrow a little beyond the green path, and then presently to another stone burrow upon the top of Woollforne hill, & from hence downe the hill to the corner of the wall of Bremellcombe ground to the great pitt.
